

1. Introduction

For successful completion of the Final Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement (EA / IS), it is essential that the consultation and engagement process be documented to appropriately categorize, and address feedback received. To support the Final EA / IS, this Record of Consultation and Engagement (RoCE) for **interested persons** has been developed to track all incoming and outgoing discussions, correspondence, and meetings. This RoCE includes information on how issues have been considered in the context of the Environmental Assessment / Impact Assessment (the Assessment Process).

This RoCE for interested persons has been prepared as per federal and provincial requirements noted below, as they relate to **interested persons only**. A RoCE for all Indigenous communities and an RoCE for government agencies are also included in the Final EA / IS. Additionally, a cumulative effects consultation report has also been prepared and is included in the Final EA / IS¹.

Interested persons are defined as individuals and groups (for example, associations, non-governmental organizations, industry, and academia) who could have an interest in the Community Access Road. This includes, but is not limited to, communities in the region, those with commercial interests (for example, forestry, trappers, outfitters, other mineral tenure holders in the area), and recreational users or those with recreational interest (for example, campers, hunters, and environmental groups). Interested persons also includes individual members of an Indigenous community who are interested in the Community Access Road, as opposed to official representatives of an Indigenous community².

The reporting timeframe for this RoCE started with the release of the Notice of Commencement (NoC) of Environmental Assessment on October 29, 2021, and ended on September 5, 2025. Consultation and engagement during this timeframe is related to the following key Project milestones, as described in the Consultation and Engagement Plan to meet the Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement (Terms of Reference (ToR) AECOM, 2020c):


- Milestone 1: Notice of Commencement of Environmental Assessment;
- Milestone 2: Effects Assessment Methods;
- Milestone 3: Identification of Preferred Alternatives; and
- Milestone 4: Review of the Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement.

Consultation and engagement activities for milestones 1, 2, 3, and 4 are included in the Final EA / IS. Activities after September 5, 2025, to the submission date of the Final EA / IS are included in **Section 4.4** below for interested persons. Consultation and engagement on Milestone 5: Review of Final Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement, will be undertaken by the federal and provincial government agencies, as shown in Figure 1, with support from the Proponent up to the regulators' decision.

1.1 About the Interested Persons Record of Consultation and Engagement

This RoCE for interested persons provides an overview of consultation and engagement carried out during the Assessment Process. The RoCE has been prepared to:

- Identify all interested persons consulted during the first four milestones of the Assessment Process and how they were identified (confidential information will not be provided);
- Describe the consultation and engagement activities that took place during the reporting time period including methods, schedule of events, notification that was given about the activity, and materials used;

- Describe how interested persons were identified and how they were consulted and engaged;
- Clearly and accurately summarize the issues shared by all interested persons during the Assessment Process;
- Describe the Proponent's response and how issues were considered in the development of the EA / IS;
- Describe any outstanding issues that required being carried forward into future phases (for example, detailed design, construction, and operations / maintenance) as identified with an "action" label and copied into Appendix AA Consultation Commitments Table. Note, there were no future commitments for issues raised by interested persons);
- Include minutes of any meetings held with interested persons; and
- Include copies of written comments (as identified as issues) received from interested persons.

The RoCE provides a detailed account of all communication exchanged with interested persons, including the following sections:

- **Summary of Key Consultation and Engagement Activities Undertaken During Preparation of the EA / IS:** An overview of key consultation and engagement activities, including when and where they happened, the number of participants, including any subgroups represented (if available), and a description of the associated information materials provided.
- **Summary of Feedback Received and Response / Action:** Identifies specific issues raised, the corresponding topic, communication channel, response / action, and how it was addressed or considered in the EA / IS, as well as section references to find more information on the topic(s).
- **Consultation and Engagement Log:** A detailed correspondence tracking table including date the correspondence occurred, method of consultation and engagement (for example, email, phone call, letter, in-person meeting), whether it was incoming or outgoing, contact name and title, Project Team member involved (for example, Marten Falls First Nation (MFFN) Leadership, MFFN Senior Community Member Advisor, MFFN Project Team or MFFN Project Consultant), and a summary of the correspondence.
- **Appendices:** The appendices include notices, letters, meeting summaries / minutes, presentations, and correspondence in the following sections:
 - Notices and Other Information Releases; and,
 - Interested Persons (categorized by groups): incoming and outgoing.

Throughout the Assessment Process, issues, comments, and interests were provided by interested persons.

- **An issue** is defined as feedback provided that has the potential to influence the Assessment Process.
- **A comment or interest** is defined as a question, statement, data, and / or information that does not have the potential to influence the Assessment Process.

To show level of effort, the only logistical correspondence (for example, scheduling a meeting) included in the appendix is when a meeting was not scheduled or was postponed.

1.2 Major Consultation and Engagement Initiatives and Feedback

During the reporting period, the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team undertook a range of communication, consultation, and engagement initiatives with interested persons to provide information about the Community Access Road, to support participation in the Assessment Process, and to provide opportunities for interested persons to ask questions and provide feedback, including during the review of the Draft EA / IS.

Communication, consultation, and engagement activities with interested persons during the Assessment Process included, but were not limited to, the following:

- **Notice of Commencement (NoC):** As part of the public consultation process, the NoC of the EA was an integral first step to initiate the formal process of the EA and notify interested persons.
- **Public Information Centres:** Five Public Information Centres (PICs) with a total of 159 attendees were held at key milestones of the Assessment Process, delivered in an open-house format, as well as virtually, and provided opportunities for interested persons to review materials, speak directly with MFFN Community Access Road Project Team members, and provide feedback.
- **Webinars and Videos:** A series of 19 webinars and 20 recorded videos were delivered throughout the Assessment Process on a range of technical and process-related topics, including valued components, cumulative effects, community well-being, route selection, and building the Community Access Road. Webinars included live question-and-answer periods, and recordings were made available for later viewing to support accessibility.

- **Ongoing Communications:** Interested persons were engaged through regular monthly emails (E-blasts) (a total of 44 were distributed), project website updates, field program notices and discussion guides, emails, phone calls, and written correspondence. These channels were used to share information, respond to inquiries, and receive feedback throughout the Assessment Process. Regular communications consistently included contact information and encouraged interested persons to reach out with questions or to request meetings.
- **Meetings:** Throughout the Assessment Process, the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team held three meetings with interested persons. The MFFN Community Access Road Project Team also received requests for meetings with interested persons and proactively offered meetings to discuss both the Community Access Road and the Assessment Process. Where meetings did not occur, the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team continued to provide information through written responses and invitations for PICs, webinars, and other consultation and engagement opportunities.
- **Outreach to Trappers and Outfitters:** Trappers and outfitters identified as interested persons were included in outreach activities. This RoCE includes consultation and engagement for trappers undertaken specifically by the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team. It was the responsibility of the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) to handle distribution and direct communication with trapline holders.
- **Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement:** The voluntary Draft EA / IS was released for review by interested persons in April 2025. Notification was supported through public notices, media advertisements, Project websites, and direct notification to individuals and organizations on the contact list. Supporting materials, including an Assessment Summary Package, executive summary, and plain language summaries, were provided to support understanding of the Draft EA / IS and to facilitate an informed review.

Summary of Issues Raised from Interested Persons

While detailed records of issues raised are provided in the consultation and engagement logs and summary tables contained in this RoCE, key themes raised by interested persons include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Access, Use, and Management of the Community Access Road;
- Construction Activities, Traffic, and Public Safety;
- Cumulative Effects with Other Projects and Activities;
- Environmental Effects and Mitigation Measures;

- Road Design, Routing, and Technical Considerations;
- Community Well-Being and Socio-Economic Considerations; and,
- Consultation, Engagement, and Transparency.

Summary of Non-Issue Feedback (Comments and Interests) from Interested Persons

In addition to issues raised by interested persons, the consultation and engagement logs demonstrate that the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team received a substantial volume of feedback from interested persons that did **not** meet the definition of an issue (i.e., did not have the potential to influence the Assessment Process). This feedback nonetheless reflects the nature of consultation and engagement undertaken and the types of interactions that occurred throughout the reporting period.

Non-issue feedback from interested persons generally included the following:

- **General Information Requests**
 - Requests for clarification about the Assessment Process, timelines, and next steps;
 - Questions about how to access documents, including the Draft EA / IS and plain language summaries;
 - Inquiries about upcoming PICs, webinars, or other engagement opportunities.
- **Clarification and Understanding**
 - Questions seeking clarification of technical terminology or assessment findings presented in reports, webinars, or display materials;
 - Requests for confirmation of information presented in E-blasts, notices, or on the website;
 - Follow-up questions after meetings, PICs, or webinars to better understand specific topics.
- **Expressions of Interest or Support**
 - Emails or phone calls expressing general interest in the Project or appreciation for receiving updates;
 - Comments noting support for improved access, connectivity, or regional development;
 - Requests to remain on the contact list or to receive ongoing updates.
- **Process-Related Comments**
 - Comments on the format, accessibility, or timing of engagement activities (for example, preferences for virtual versus in-person events);

- Suggestions regarding communication methods or how information could be presented more clearly;
- Acknowledgements of responses provided by the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team.
- **Out-of-Scope or Informational Inquiries**
 - Questions related to matters outside the scope of the Assessment Process (for example, broader regional development policy, unrelated infrastructure projects, or regulatory matters not specific to the Community Access Road);
 - Requests for information that fell under the responsibility of other agencies or proponents, which were redirected as appropriate.

This non-issue feedback is documented in the consultation and engagement logs included in this RoCE and demonstrates ongoing two-way communication between the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team and interested persons. While these comments did not require formal responses in the context of the Assessment Process, they informed ongoing communication approaches and supported transparency and accessibility throughout consultation and engagement activities. A complete list of interests / comments is included in **Appendix B12 (as part of Appendix XB-B)**.

1.3 Federal and Provincial Requirements

There are both federal and provincial requirements that set the framework for the Assessment Processes. These are summarized below and were used to inform the Consultation and Engagement Plan developed to guide communications, engagement, and consultation related to the Community Access Road.

1.3.1 Federal Requirements

There are federal requirements that provide a framework for the Impact Assessment (IA). Federal requirements for consultation and engagement on the Community Access Road, specific to interested persons, are outlined in the following documents:

- Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines (Impact Assessment Agency of Canada, 2020a);
- Public Participation Plan for the Marten Falls Community Access Road Project Impact Assessment (Impact Assessment Agency of Canada, 2020b); and,
- Indigenous Engagement and Partnership Plan for the Marten Falls Community Access Road (Impact Assessment Agency of Canada, 2020c).

Additionally, the Tailored Impact Statement Guidelines require Gender-Based Analysis Plus (GBA Plus) to be applied to IAs in Canada. **Section 11** of the Final EA / IS

provides information on how GBA Plus has been applied to the Community Access Road.

1.3.2 Provincial Requirements

The Marten Falls-Ontario Memorandum of Understanding on Shared Consultation Responsibilities (AECOM, 2020) was signed in January 2020 between MFFN and the Province of Ontario. The Memorandum outlines shared responsibilities regarding the procedural aspects of Ontario's duty to consult in the context of the provincial Environmental Assessment for the proposed Community Access Road, for potentially impacted and interested Indigenous communities. Roles and responsibilities governed by the Memorandum include consultation planning and notification, delivery of the planned activities, issues resolution and follow-up, and record keeping for consultation and engagement with Indigenous communities.

A ToR is the first step in the provincial EA process and is a roadmap for planning and decision-making. It outlines how an EA should be prepared, including the studies to be conducted, the process for identifying and assessing the effects of a proposed project, and how people should be consulted.

The ToR for the Community Access Road was prepared in accordance with the provincial *Environmental Assessment Act* (Government of Ontario, 1990a) and the Code of Practice: Preparing and Reviewing Terms of Reference for the Environmental Assessments in Ontario (Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks 2014), and was submitted to the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP).

The ToR includes the Consultation and Engagement Plan (AECOM, 2020c), which is used to guide consultation and engagement efforts throughout the Assessment Process. This document serves as a useful reference, particularly the following sections:

- Section 2.1: Principles of Consultation (guiding principles of the MFFN Community-Based Land Use Planning Team for Community Access Road consultation and engagement);
- Section 2.2: Nishnawbe Aski Nation's Consultation Policy; and,
- Section 2.3: Duty to Consult (provincial requirements).

The ToR was approved with amendments on October 8, 2021, and the Notice of Commencement (NoC) of the provincial EA for the Community Access Road was posted on October 29, 2021.

Provincial requirements were inclusive of all federal requirements, and both were met during the Assessment Process. Additional requirements outlined in the Marten Falls-

Ontario Memorandum of Understanding on Shared Consultation Responsibilities were also met.

2. Identification of Interested Persons

Interested persons are defined as individuals and groups (for example, associations, non-governmental organizations, industry, and academia) who could have an interest in the Community Access Road. This includes, but is not limited to, communities in the region, those with commercial interests (for example, forestry, trappers, outfitters, other mineral tenure holders in the area) and recreational users or those with recreational interest (for example, campers, hunters, and environmental groups). Interested persons also includes individual members of an Indigenous community that are interested in the Community Access Road, as opposed to official representatives of an Indigenous community.

Additionally, MFFN has consulted and engaged with the members of the public, as listed in the Public Participation Plan for the Marten Falls Community Access Road Project Impact Assessment (Impact Assessment Agency of Canada, 2020b), with the following exceptions:

- Anishinabek Nation asked to be removed from the contact list in 2023; and,
- Noront Resources Ltd. was removed from the contact list in 2023 following updates from the provincial government. Noront Resources Ltd. was renamed to Ring of Fire Metals and has been re-added to the contact list.

This RoCE for interested persons includes consultation and engagement for trappers undertaken specifically by the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team. It was the responsibility of the MNR to handle distribution and direct communication with trapline holders. Additional information on the consultation and engagement with trappers provided to MNR to distribute is in **Appendix B6 (as part of Appendix XB-B)**.

Members of the public and anyone interested in the Community Access Road have been able to join the contact list to receive frequent updates.

Table 1 outlines the consultation and engagement milestones, input, and timing. **Table 2** provides a complete list of consultation and engagement activities for interested persons. **Table 3** summarizes key input received from interested persons and how it has been considered.

3. Consultation and Engagement Milestones, Input, and Timing

Consultation and engagement at each milestone were designed in a stepwise manner to receive feedback on targeted input before advancing to the next stage of the Assessment Process. **Table 1** outlines each milestone, the targeted input and feedback requested, and timing.

As noted in **Table 1**, Proponent-led consultation and engagement officially ends with the submission of the Final EA / IS to the regulators. Consultation and engagement during the review of the Final EA / IS is undertaken by the federal and provincial government agencies. The Proponent, however, will support the regulator’s review process as necessary up until the regulators’ decision is made (e.g., provide responses to comments, attend meetings as requested).

4. Consultation and Engagement Activities

The following sections provide a summary of activities and corresponding feedback received, with **Table 2** including a full list of consultation and engagement activities during the first four milestones: NoC of Environmental Assessment; Effects Assessment Methods; Identification of Preferred Alternatives; and Review of the Draft EA / IS specific to **interested persons**. **Table 3** is a summary of feedback received and responses / actions. Note that PIC #1 and #2 were part of the ToR and are therefore not included below.

4.1 Notifications and Information Releases

Website

The Community Access Road website was developed to provide ongoing access to information, planned consultation and engagement activities, and a method to receive feedback and comments. The website was updated throughout the Assessment Process and published information at key milestones. Examples of information that can be found on the website: frequently asked questions, Assessment Process information and timelines, video and webinar recordings, news stories, information on the Indigenous Knowledge (IK) Program, and all existing publicly available documentation and reports (including summary reports, field notices, and E-blasts). A contact page was available for anyone to submit questions, comments, or concerns. The website was continuously updated to reflect information that had been shared via the E-blasts and social media accounts. The website was developed and maintained to allow for users with low bandwidth and slow internet connection to easily access information.

Notice of Commencement of Environmental Assessment

On October 29, 2021, the NoC of Environmental Assessment was circulated to MFFN, neighbouring Indigenous communities, government agencies, and interested persons, including individuals or groups that are potentially affected by the Community Access Road and / or have an interest in the Community Access Road. The NoC of Environmental Assessment was circulated to individuals and groups in the contact list, which was continually updated throughout the Assessment Process.

The NoC of Environmental Assessment was available on the Community Access Road website in English, French, Ojibway, Oji-Cree, and Cree (Marten Falls First Nation, 2021). The website was periodically updated with Community Access Road information including all relevant notices (for example, NoC, PIC invitations, Notice of the Release of the Draft EA / IS) and other materials such as mapping.

To support the circulation of the NoC of Environmental Assessment, notices were also distributed via email to people identified on the contact list on October 29, 2021. Notices were distributed via mail and fax on November 1, 2021. Advertisements were placed on Wawatay Radio, CKPR-FM Radio, and CFNO Radio during the week of November 1 to 5, 2021. The MFFN Community Access Road Project Team worked with the MECP to finalize a circulation list that provided geographic coverage in a variety of mediums (for example, mail, fax, email, newspapers, and radio) for potentially interested Indigenous communities and persons. A copy of the notice and other information was posted on the Community Access Road website. The NoC is included in **Appendix A1 (as part of Appendix XB-A)** and was published in the following newspapers: Chronicle Journal; Thunder Bay Source; Wawatay News; TBNewsWatch; Windspeaker; and, Anishinabek News.

Public Information Centre #3

On June 13, 2022, a notice was circulated to the MFFN community, neighboring Indigenous communities, government agencies, and interested persons regarding PIC #3, which was held on June 27, 2022, in Thunder Bay and June 29, 2022, in Geraldton. The notice was provided via both hard and electronic copies (for example, mail, email) and posted on the Community Access Road website on June 13, 2022, in English, French, Cree, Ojibway, and Oji-Cree. The notice was published from June 14 to 17, 2022, in the following newspapers: Thunder Bay Source, Wawatay News, Geraldton Times Star, and The Chronicle Journal. Online advertisements were posted from June 13 to 27, 2022, through the following media outlets: Greenstone Community Calendar, Northern Ontario Business, NWO NewsWatch, SN NewsWatch, Thunder Bay NewsWatch, Windspeaker, and Anishinabek News. Radio advertisements were also released during the same period on the following radio stations: CFNO Radio, 91-5 CKPR, Rock94 Radio, and Wawatay Radio. Additionally, the PIC was advertised on the Community Access Road Facebook page and the private MFFN Facebook page. PIC #3 materials can be found in **Appendix A3 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**.

Public Information Centre #4

PIC #4 was held on December 7, 2022, in Thunder Bay and December 8, 2022, in Geraldton. A formal notice and invitation to PIC #4 was published on the Community Access Road website on November 22, 2022, in English, French, Cree, Ojibway, and Oji-Cree. The notice was published between November 22 and December 1, 2022, in the following newspapers: Thunder Bay Source, Geraldton Times Star, and The Chronicle Journal. Online advertisements were posted between November 22 and December 9, 2022, through the following media outlets: Greenstone Community Calendar, Northern Ontario Business, NWO NewsWatch, SN NewsWatch, Thunder Bay NewsWatch, and Windspeaker. Radio advertisements were released between November 28 and December 9, 2022, on the following radio stations: CFNO Radio, 91-5 CKPR, Rock94 Radio, and Wawatay Radio. Additionally, the PIC was advertised on

the Community Access Road Facebook page and the private MFFN Facebook page. PIC #4 materials can be found in **Appendix A3 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**.

Public Information Centre #5

PIC #5 was held on October 25, 2023, in Thunder Bay and October 26, 2023, in Geraldton. A formal notice and invitation to PIC #5 was published on the Community Access Road website on October 10, 2023, in English, French, Cree, Ojibway, and Oji-Cree. The notice was published between October 19 and October 23, 2023, in the following newspapers: Thunder Bay Source, Geraldton Times Star, and The Chronicle Journal. Online advertisements were posted between October 11 and October 26, 2023, through the following media outlets: Greenstone Facebook Private page, Northern Ontario Business, NWO NewsWatch, SN NewsWatch, Thunder Bay NewsWatch, and Wawatay News. Radio advertisements were released during the same period on the following radio stations: CFNO Radio and Wawatay Radio. Additionally, the PIC was advertised on the Community Access Road Facebook and LinkedIn pages and the private MFFN Facebook page. PIC #5 materials can be found in **Appendix A3 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**.

Notice of Publication of the Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement and Public Information Centre #6

On April 22, 2025, a combined Notice of the Draft EA / IS and PIC #6 (formally titled as the Notice of Publication of the Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement) was circulated to interested persons, including individuals or groups that are potentially affected by the Community Access Road and / or have an interest in the Community Access Road.

The Notice of the Draft EA / IS and PIC #6 was available on the Community Access Road website, including a dedicated website for the Draft EA / IS in English, French, Ojibway, Oji-Cree, and Cree.

The notice was distributed to the contact list on April 22, 2025. Advertisements were placed on Wawatay Radio, CHRZ-FM (91.3) REZFM Radio, and CFNO Radio and they ran between April 21 to May 26, 2025. The notice was published in the following newspapers: Chronicle Journal; The Times Star; North Ontario Business; Wawatay News; TBNewsWatch; Northwest Ontario News; Windspeaker; and, Superior North News.

The notice was also posted on the MFFN Community Access Road Facebook, Instagram, and LinkedIn pages on April 22, April 26, and May 26, 2025, and the private Geraldton Facebook page. The Notice of the Draft EA / IS and PIC #6, along with supporting documents can be found in **Appendix A2.1 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**.

Public Information Centre #6

PIC #6 was held on May 26, 2025, in Thunder Bay and May 29, 2025, in Geraldton. The formal notice (combined with the Notice of the Draft EA / IS) is described above. All PIC #6 materials can be found in **Appendix A3 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**.

Monthly E-blasts

Throughout the Assessment Process, newsletters (also known as E-blasts) were distributed via email to approximately 600 people identified on the contact list. E-blasts were regularly distributed and included Community Access Road updates relevant to the month of distribution. Content included upcoming or summary of results of field programs, consultation and engagement activities, and the opportunity to ask questions or schedule a meeting. Links to the Community Access Road's social media pages and contact information were always included. Additionally, E-blasts were published on the Community Access Road website, receiving over 9,596 views. All E-blasts can be found in **Appendix A4 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**.

Field Program Notifications

Several field programs took place during the Assessment Process. To help better understand the field programs related to valued components, field notices were distributed with plain language information about what the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team was studying, the importance, timelines, and what could be expected when crews were in the field (for example, an increase in air traffic as crews travel by helicopter). Field notices encouraged recipients to contact the Community Access Road Project Team if they had any questions or comments. Discussion guides were created to introduce new field programs and were distributed in advance of field notices with key questions to help shape programs (including timing and locations); however, some field programs required quick mobilization (such as, winter programs that required recent snow fall) in which case discussion guides were distributed in tandem with field notices. Notices were distributed via email to the contact list prior to the relevant field program taking place and shared on social media platforms. These notices are provided in **Appendix A5 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**.

Webinar and Video Notifications

Notifications for virtual communication and engagement opportunities, such as webinars, were distributed via email to the contact list and posted on social media platforms (including the Community Access Road Facebook page and the private MFFN and Ogoki Facebook pages) on an as needed basis. Notifications included the date and time of the webinar, links for registration, and webinar poster attachments. Reminder emails were sent shortly before the live webinar occurred. Videos were posted to the Community Access Road website and included in relevant E-blasts on an as needed basis. Videos were also shared to the Community Access Road Facebook, Instagram,

and LinkedIn pages to encourage broader outreach with interested persons. Email information for webinars, along with webinar posters, are provided in **Appendix A6** and information on videos is provided in **Appendix A7 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**.

4.2 Summary of Interested Persons Consultation and Engagement

The following provides details regarding all public-facing consultation and engagement, as well as specific consultation and engagement with those categorized as interested persons for milestones 1, 2, 3, and 4. Detailed descriptions of consultation and engagement activities are meant to provide context for all groups engaged, and may also include participation from government agencies and Indigenous communities.

Throughout the Assessment Process, several interested persons, including academics, local organizations, advisory committees, remote outfitters, trappers, and industry representatives, requested or participated in engagement activities related to the Community Access Road. These engagements occurred alongside broader public outreach and provided opportunities to discuss Project information, gather questions, and understand the interests of individuals and organizations with land- or resource-based connections in the region.

Email and Phone Outreach

Throughout the Assessment Process, the Project Team engaged interested persons through focused email and phone outreach. This outreach supported ongoing communication with individuals and organizations who expressed an interest in the Community Access Road or whose activities may intersect with the Community Access Road.

These methods supported timely distribution of notices, updates, and invitations to engagement activities such as Public Information Centres, webinars, field programs, and the review of the Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement. Interested persons frequently contacted the Project Team by email or phone to request information, provide comments, ask questions about technical material, or seek clarification on timelines and next steps.

The Project Team responded to all inquiries, provided follow-up information, and offered meetings when appropriate. Email and phone correspondence also facilitated targeted outreach to businesses, non-governmental organizations, academic researchers, tourism operators, and members of the public. This consistent and ongoing outreach contributed to transparent communication and helped ensure that interested persons had accessible avenues to engage throughout the Assessment Process.

Broader outreach to mining, forestry, remote outfitter, and trapper groups occurred on October 1, 2024, November 13, 2024, and May 20, 2025, offering one-on-one or informal virtual meetings to discuss potential Project interactions with their operations and discuss potential mitigation measures. Additional calls to remote outfitters on August 8, 2025, resulted in conversations with two operators about the proposed route, potential business implications, and opportunities to provide comments during the Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement review period. Information specific to mining, forestry, outfitter, and trappers is included in the Land and Resource Use Technical Support Document (Appendix U) of the Final Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement. **Public Information Centre #3**

The first round of PICs during the Assessment Process (PIC #3) was held on June 27, 2022, in Thunder Bay and on June 29, 2022, in the Municipality of Greenstone (Geraldton), respectively. PIC #3 provided an update on the Community Access Road, including updates since the ToR; the Assessment Process; study areas, including specific updates made to reflect potential sources of aggregate material and input received from Indigenous communities; preliminary results of field programs and information on upcoming field programs; overview and importance of IK and Aboriginal and / or Treaty Rights and Interests (ATRI); how Indigenous communities have been involved to date and plans for future consultation and engagement; feedback heard to date and how it is being considered; ongoing and future consultation and engagement opportunities; and next steps.

The following printed and online materials were available for attendees:

- Field Notices, including Terrain and Soils Field Investigation, Surface Water Fish and Habitat, Wolverine Den Surveys, and the Early Spring programs; and,
- Maps of: Route Alternatives; Broader Area / Neighbouring Indigenous Communities; Aerial Waterfowl Study Area; Bats Study Area; Bird Field Program Study Area; Fish Surface Water Study Area; Groundwater Study Area, Ungulates Study Area; Vegetation Study Area; Wolverine Study Area; and Tourism Outfitters.

Approximately 33 individuals attended PIC #3 (25 attendees in Thunder Bay on June 27, 2022, and 8 attendees in Geraldton on June 29, 2022). Attendees included Indigenous community members, government agencies, members of the public / local residents, environmental groups, and industry representatives.

All feedback provided at PIC #3 was considered an interest or comment; no issues were raised during the session. An issue is defined as a question, statement, data, and / or information brought forward by an Indigenous community, government agency, the public or other interested persons that has the potential to influence the Assessment Process. An interest / comment list is included in **Appendix B12 (as part of Appendix XB-B)**. Key feedback themes reflected a range of interests and comments, highlighting the importance of safety, environmental stewardship, and ongoing consultation and engagement with interested persons. The following high-level interests / comments were provided:

- Specific suggestions and preferences for details of route alignment;
- Timeline concerns;
- Role of MFFN community members and how the Community Access Road is different than other road projects in the area;
- Interest in participating in upcoming field programs;
- Safety concerns;
- Suggestions on how to increase engagement;
- General consensus that MFFN community members are positive about the Community Access Road; and,

- Need for respecting the land when the road is built.

Public Information Centre #4

A second round of PICs during the Assessment Process (PIC #4) was held on December 7, 2022, in Thunder Bay and on December 8, 2022, in Geraldton. PIC #4 provided an update on the Community Access Road, including an overview and updates since PIC #3, as well as what was heard and how feedback was considered; existing conditions results for completed studies; assessment of impacts and comparison of route alternatives; preliminary results of field programs and information on upcoming field programs; overview and importance of IK and ATRI; process for identifying the preliminary technically Preferred Route and how route alternatives would be assessed, recommended and a Preferred Route chosen; and next steps.

The following printed and online materials were made available to attendees:

Approximately 46 individuals attended PIC #4 (30 attendees in Thunder Bay on December 7, 2022, and 16 attendees in Geraldton on December 8, 2022). Attendees included Indigenous community members, government agencies, members of the public / local residents, environmental groups, and industry representatives.

A third round of PICs during the Assessment Process (PIC #5) was held on October 25, 2023, in Thunder Bay and on October 26, 2023, in Geraldton. PIC #5 provided an update on the Community Access Road, including current stage of the process, as well as the different construction steps needed to build a road; what has happened since PIC #4, including what was heard and how feedback was considered; what was heard at the ATRI Forum in February 2023 and plans for the next forum; existing conditions results for completed studies; how IK was used and how it informed the process; preliminary technically Preferred Route recommendation, how route alternatives were assessed, recommended, and a preliminary technically Preferred Route chosen; cumulative effects assessment and why it is important and the project inclusions list; and next steps and future opportunities to get involved.

- Existing Conditions reports (plain language summaries); and,

Approximately 35 individuals attended PIC #5 (21 attendees in Thunder Bay on October 25, 2023, and 14 attendees in Geraldton on October 26, 2023). Public Information Centre #6

The fourth round of PICs during the Assessment Process (PIC # 6) was held on May 26, 2025, in Thunder Bay, and May 29, 2025, in Geraldton. PIC #6 was focused on the Draft EA / IS, community well-being, and cumulative effects. Information included: Draft EA / IS review process, schedule; ways to review and provide comments; feedback received to date; land and resource use; information on the Country Foods Program; potential effects and mitigations; cumulative effects process and results; final projects / activities considered as part of the Cumulative Effects Assessment; and, how the Community Access Road could affect community well-being for Marten Falls and nearby communities .

The following printed and online materials were available for attendees:

- A hard copy of the display boards;
- Assessment Summary: Draft EA / IS, as a package;
- Draft EA / IS frequently asked questions;
- Draft EA / IS executive summary;
- 11 plain language summaries (English and Ojibway);
- Maps of: Preferred Route, Remote Tourism Outfitter Camp, Potential Cumulative Effects Project Inclusions List, Water Crossings;
- Community Well-Being – Economics Information Sheet;
- Cumulative Effects Inclusions List Information Sheet; and,
- Socio-Community Effects and Mitigations Information Sheet.

Approximately 27 individuals attended PIC #6 (11 attendees in Thunder Bay on May 26, 2025, and 16 in Geraldton on May 29, 2025). Attendees included Indigenous community members, federal and provincial agencies, members of the public / local residents, environmental groups, and industry representatives. Attendees included:

All feedback received at PIC #6 was documented as an interest or comment; no issues were identified. For the purposes of the Community Access Road, an issue is defined as a question, statement, data, and / or information submitted by an Indigenous community, government agency, member of the public, or other interested party that has the potential to influence the Assessment Process. A complete list of interests / comments is included in **Appendix B12 (as part of Appendix XB-B)**.

The following high-level interests / comments were shared by PIC #6 attendees:

- Comments about supporting documents and maps;
- Comments about road design;
- Concerns regarding public access to the road and safety;
- Discussion on wildlife, species, and environmental considerations in the Community Access Road area;
- Discussion on proposed mitigation measures; and
- Community well-being, including job opportunities.

Discussion Guides

Discussion guides for various field programs were shared with the contact list prior to the commencement of field programs. These guides provided an overview of the upcoming field programs, solicited feedback on key questions listed in the guide, and encouraged interested individuals to book a meeting with the Community Access Road Team to discuss their questions and concerns, as well as their ATRI in the study area. The discussion guides received over 1,871 views. Insights shared had the opportunity to help shape and enrich the field programs.

After the discussion guides were distributed and feedback was collected (if provided), a field notice was distributed with confirmed dates for the field programs. Additional information related to planned field programs was also included in the monthly E-blasts and shared through social media. A web-based version, with an online survey, was made available on the Community Access Road website. Discussion guides are available in **Appendix A8 (as part of Appendix XB-A)** and on the Community Access Road website (<https://www.martenfallsaccessroad.ca/documents/#DG>).

Online Webinars and Videos

Additional virtual communication and consultation and engagement methods included online webinars and videos. These materials were produced on an as-needed basis, and featured information on valued components, cumulative effects, community well-being, route selection, and engineering and construction. Each webinar offered a live question and answer session at the end of the presentation. All webinars and videos were intended for anyone interested in attending, including all Indigenous communities, government agencies and interested persons. All videos can be found on the Community Access Road website (<https://www.martenfallsaccessroad.ca/our-studies/>). Webinar recordings are hosted on an external website and are linked through the Community Access Road website (<https://vimeo.com/showcase/mffn-webinars>).

The majority of feedback received during the webinars consisted of interests and comments, which are available in **Appendix B12 (as part of Appendix XB-B)**. Issues raised during the webinars are available in **Table 3**. An issue is defined as a question, statement, data, and / or information brought forward by an Indigenous community, government agency, the public or other interested persons that has the potential to influence the Assessment Process

 - Locations of crossing;
 - Logging rights for wood; and
 - Access to the webinar after the session;
 - 1 comment on compensation for impacted individuals and 1 comment on job opportunities; and
 - 97 viewed the recording.
- **Climate Change Adaptation (including post-webinar survey) (February 8, 2024):**
 - 40 registered, 26 attended;
 - 6 questions were asked:
 - Inclusion of 10-year events;
 - Recording weather as part of the climate studies;
 - Construction modifications for climate change;
 - Changes in plants or animals due to climate change or road effects;

- Mitigation strategies; and
- Lyme disease;
- 1 comment regarding temperature changes affecting water levels, ice / snow, geese migration, and snowmobiling; 3 additional comments regarding a reference to check jet stream effects and the increase in forest fires;
- 2 questions were asked using an in-webinar poll feature:
 - Is climate change affecting the traditional activities in your community?
 - 9 responded yes;
 - 1 responded no; and
 - 1 responded they don't know.
 - Have you noticed changes in your traditional territory over time?
 - Weather events (floods, fires, severe storms, and drought): 11;
 - Rivers / lakes: 8;
 - Wildlife and plant life: 7;
 - Sacred cultural sites: 2;
 - Land use: 6; and
 - Hunting / Fishing / Trapping: 5;
- A post-webinar survey with 14 questions was shared with webinar attendees distributed to the contact list and posted on the Community Access Road website and social media accounts to gather feedback from rightsholders and interested persons on their experiences with climate change. A copy of the post-webinar survey is available in **Appendix A6 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**. High-level themes in the survey feedback included, but were not limited to:
 - Importance of climate change: all respondents indicated that climate change is very important;
 - Behavioural changes: participants have made various changes in their behaviour due to environmental changes, such as conserving water, recycling, and reducing carbon footprints;
 - Impact on traditional activities: climate change is negatively affecting traditional activities like hunting, fishing, and gathering. Some communities reported changes in wildlife behaviour and availability; and,
 - Impact on the environment: extreme heat and precipitation causing increased incidents of drought and wildfires impacting air quality, vegetation; and traditional ways of life.
- 91 viewed the recording.

Valued Component Videos

Videos on valued components provided information about what was being studied and why, what had been learned, and how individuals could get involved. The 15 videos produced received a total of 2,056 views and 130 downloads:

4.2.1 Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Assessment

MFFN chose to release a Draft EA / IS even though this is not a regulatory requirement. Doing so, however, provided Indigenous communities, interested persons, and government agencies early access to Community Access Road information and findings, and created meaningful opportunities for feedback prior to the submission of the Final EA / IS. This proactive step allowed for a more collaborative process. Without the release of the Draft EA / IS, the first and only opportunity to review and comment would have occurred after submission of the Final EA / IS to federal and provincial agencies. By contrast, the Draft EA / IS review period resulted in over 1,900, 10 of which were from interested persons. Comments were received from Wildlife Conservation Society Canada, Aandoomozwe Outfitters, Albany-Ogoki Outposts, and members of the public. These comments informed the preparation of the Final EA / IS and allowed the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team to incorporate input where possible in the Final EA / IS.

This report does not include formal comments submitted on the Draft EA / IS or the responses to those comments. This information is available in the Feedback

and Response Log, available in Appendix C of the Final EA / IS. This log includes: feedback received; the corresponding responses; and resulting changes to the Final EA / IS, where applicable. If specific topics were raised, section references of the Final EA / IS are also provided to direct readers to more detailed information.

The public and regulator review period started on April 22, 2025, for a 60-day review period. The comment period for Indigenous communities, interested persons, and regulators was intended to conclude on June 23, 2025, however, requests for extensions were received from government regulators and Indigenous communities. Comments and feedback accepted up until September 5, 2025, are included within this reporting period.

Key information related to the Draft EA / IS was provided in the monthly E-blasts, videos and social media posts leading up to the official release. The MFFN Community Access Road Project Team relayed information on the Draft EA / IS through various information outlets, including but not limited to, monthly E-blasts, webinars, videos, monthly outreach to interested persons key contacts and website updates. A dedicated EA / IS website was created to host all documents related to the Draft EA / IS, including Technical Support Documents, the Assessment Summary Package, plain language summaries, the RoCE for interested persons, and Milestones #1, #2, and #3 Progress Reports. This website was also a channel to receive feedback on the Draft EA / IS.

The following activities were undertaken to support consultation and engagement on the Draft EA / IS, specific to interested persons.

4.2.1.1 Assessment Summary: Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement

One of the federal requirements that needs to be met prior to obtaining approval to proceed with construction activities is the preparation of an assessment summary of the Draft EA / IS that contains sufficient details for the reader to understand the project. To meet this requirement, and provide readers with easy access to the information they value most, an Assessment Summary package was created and consisted of the following components:

- MFFN Chief's letter;
- An Introduction to the Assessment Summary
- Executive Summary of the Draft EA / IS;
- Frequently Asked Questions: Draft EA /IS;
- An Introduction to the Plain Language Summaries and Technical Supporting Documents;
- Eleven technical discipline plain language summaries which covered:
 - Archaeology and Cultural Heritage;

- Climate Change Adaptation;
- Community Well-Being;
- Fish and Habitat;
- Groundwater and Surface Water;
- Acoustics (Noise and Vibration);
- Peatlands;
- Physiography, Terrain, Soils, and Vegetation;
- Ungulates;
- Visual Environment and Land and Resource Use; and,
- Wildlife and Birds;
- Map of the Preferred Route;
- Cumulative Effects Inclusions List; and,
- USB drive that included all the components listed above, the Draft EA / IS, and the Technical Support Documents.

The Assessment Summary was available on the Community Access Road website, for viewing at PIC #6, and at the following public library locations:

- Greenstone Public Library – Geraldton Branch;
- Greenstone Public Library – Long Lac Branch;
- Sioux Lookout Public Library;
- Thunder Bay Public Library – Waverley Resource Library; and,
- Timmins Public Library.

4.2.1.2 Webinar Series: Draft EA / IS

Four webinars were held to support the Draft EA / IS review. The webinars focused on a valued component from each theme: Land, Water and People showcasing the potential effects, mitigation measures, residual effects and cumulative effects of each. The series resulted in 15 questions and 43 views of the recordings. The following outlines registration and attendance, and high-level questions asked and comments received, and recording views for each webinar:

- **Community Well-Being (May 6, 2026)**
 - 23 registered, 17 attended;
 - 4 questions were asked:

- The impact of the road on MFFN community members;
- How the road will change the experiences of Elders and youth;
- How the road could impact traditional relationships with land and water; and
- MFFN community members excitement and concerns related to the road;
- 14 viewed the recording;
- **Land Valued Components: Ungulates (Atik / Caribou & Mooz / Moose) (May 15, 2025)**
 - 13 registered, 8 attended;
 - 4 questions were asked / comments received:
 - Mitigation measures to prevent ungulates from crossing the road;
 - Measures proposed to restrict increased hunting;
 - Concern about pipes under the road freezing; and
 - Mitigation measures proposed to protect moose habitat;
 - 5 viewed the recording;
- **Water: Fish and Fish Habitat (May 22, 2025)**
 - 22 registered, 11 attended;
 - 6 questions were asked:
 - Timeline for field studies;
 - Culverts in construction zone;
 - Number of culvert crossings;
 - Cumulative effects for fish;
 - Plans for how to prevent overfishing; and
 - Mitigation measures to prevent overfishing;
 - 1 viewed the recording;
- **Land and Resource Use (June 5, 2025)**
 - 19 registered, 13 attended;
 - 1 question was asked:
 - The Community Access Road timeline and any potential pressure to accelerate it; and,
 - 23 viewed the recording.

4.2.1.3 The Assessment Process Videos

The videos on the Assessment Process provided information about the federal and provincial processes. A total of five videos were produced that covered topics of route selection, feedback received, the Draft EA / IS, Community Access Road effects and mitigations, and cumulative effects. The videos received a total of 527 views.

- **MFFN Community Access Road Preferred Route Update (January 7, 2025):** The video outlined the factors considered in determining the Preferred Route including science, IK, and community input. An explanation of the preliminary route selection process was provided along with the next steps that would be taken on the Community Access Road Preferred Route. The video received a total of 148 views.
- **What We've Heard (April 7, 2025):** This video provided key comments received on the Community Access Road, which covered topics such as access, cost of living, job opportunities, and healthcare. The video received a total of 161 views.
- **Draft EA / IS (May 6, 2025):** The Draft EA / IS video provided an explanation of the Draft EA / IS, a summary of what is included in the Draft EA / IS, how to provide feedback, and the importance of receiving feedback for the Community Access Road. The video received a total of 136 views.
- **Understanding Project Effects and Mitigations (May 9, 2025):** This video provided a summary and explanation of the seven stages the Community Access Road will go through to assess the effects and mitigations which include collecting information about existing conditions, the Preferred Route selection, potential effects, identifying mitigations, residual effects, characterizing cumulative effects, and the Cumulative Effects Assessment. The video received a total of 33 views.
- **Understanding Cumulative Effects (August 1, 2025):** This video explained that a key part of the Assessment Process for the Community Access Road is understanding Cumulative Effects, or the combined effects on the environment of past, present, and future activities in the Community Access Road's study area. The video explained that temporal overlap, spatial overlap, and reasonably foreseeable projects are considered to make informed and responsible decisions on the Community Access Road. The video guided viewers to the plain language summaries, webinar series, and the Draft EA / IS website for additional information. The video received a total of 49 views.

Links to all videos can be found in **Appendix A7 (as part of Appendix XB-A)**.

4.2.2 Meetings and Event Participation with Interested Persons

A number of interested persons expressed interest in meetings related to the Community Access Road. The following meetings were requested / discussed and / or held between to support consultation and engagement on the Community Access Road and for informational purposes.

Several meetings and presentations were held with interested persons between 2024 and 2025, either at the request of individuals or through invitations extended to the Project Team.

On October 24, 2024, the Project Team met virtually with a Laurentian University professor, who provided a presentation on climate change projections, including information on precautionary approaches, Climate Atlas resources, and climate engagement tools relevant to northern communities.

In November 2024, the Project Team corresponded with Leuenberger Air Services Limited, who initiated contact to discuss concerns related to the Ogoki River crossing. The Project Team attempted to schedule a meeting and, on May 21, 2025, followed up again during the Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement review period to invite Leuenberger Air to participate in consultation activities. As of September 5, 2025, no meeting had been scheduled.

Also in November 2024, the Project Team contacted Twin Lakes Outfitters to offer a meeting regarding their questions about river crossings. Twin Lakes Outfitters indicated they did not have availability to meet at that time, and no additional concerns were shared prior to September 5, 2025.

On November 20, 2024, the Project Team attended the Geraldton Area Natural Resources Advisory Committee fall general meeting as a guest presenter. The presentation provided an overview of the Community Access Road in advance of the Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement, and committee members raised questions about tourism-related activity, access and ownership of the road, and availability of Preferred Route mapping. The Project Team offered an opportunity to meet again at Public Information Centre #6 in Geraldton or at another time convenient to the committee. The committee advised that attending Public Information Centre #6 would suffice. An invitation to attend Public Information Centre #6 was issued to Geraldton Area Natural Resources Advisory Committee. A meeting summary is available in **Appendix B1.3 (as part of Appendix XB-B)**.

In May 2024, the Greenstone Economic Development Corporation invited Chief Bruce Achneepineskum to speak at their general meeting. While the Chief confirmed availability, limited preparation time prevented the meeting from being added to the agenda. The Greenstone Economic Development Corporation expressed interest in scheduling a future engagement opportunity, though a date was not secured.

Between March 2 and 3, 2025, the Project Team presented at the Prospectors & Developers Association of Canada Conference, delivering two presentations on the Community Access Road and hosting an information booth to discuss the Community Access Road with conference participants. Supporting materials included the Chief's letter, plain language summaries, the cumulative effects information sheet and Project Inclusions list and the Draft EA / IS Frequently Asked Questions.

4.3 Consultation and Engagement From September 6, 2025, to February 13, 2026

As previously noted, the reporting period for the RoCE for interested persons ended on September 5, 2025. A number of activities; however, occurred after the end of the reporting period but before the submission of the Final EA / IS. These are included below to demonstrate consultation and engagement efforts leading up to the submission of the Final EA / IS, and occurred between September 6, 2025, to February 13, 2026.

4.3.1 Public Information Centre #7 (Virtual)

The fifth round of PICs during the Assessment Process (PIC #7) was held virtually on February 4, 2026. Notification of PIC #7 was provided through an email distributed on January 27, 2026, as well as website notifications and social media posts. PIC #7 focused on the release of the Final EA / IS. Information presented included an overview of the Assessment Process, the selection of the Preferred Route, feedback received on the Draft EA / IS, and the Final EA / IS review process. The presentation was pre-recorded and uploaded to the project website on the same day as the PIC to allow those who were unable to attend the live session the opportunity to view it at their convenience.

A total of 31 individuals registered for the virtual PIC #7 session, and approximately 22 participants attended. Attendees represented a broad cross-section of audiences, including community members and / or representatives from six different Indigenous communities, federal and provincial government agencies, interested persons, environmental organizations, and industry representatives. A Question and Answer period with the Project Team members followed the pre-recorded presentation. Key question and comment themes reflected a range of interests which included job opportunities, project timelines, the Final EA / IS, maintenance and operations, and bridges and crossings.

The following high-level questions and comments were received:

- Job opportunities and access to job information;
- Construction timelines;

- ATRI feedback and summary document;
- Community Access Road governance, maintenance, and monitoring;
- Final EA / IS review timeline concerns;
- Consultation and engagement; and
- River crossings.

A meeting summary of PIC #7 will be posted on the Community Access Road website.

4.3.2 Meetings with Interested Persons

On October 21, 2025, the MFFN Community Access Road Project Team met with Wildlife Conservation Society Canada (WCS). Discussion with WCS included wolverine denning habitat, caribou habitat, mitigation hierarchy, and monitoring and survey techniques. The MFFN Community Access Road Project Team noted that the caribou and wolverine effects assessments include an evaluation of aerial surveys, discussion of mitigation and monitoring approaches, as well as a consideration of cumulative effects.

4.3.1 Notice of EA Availability

MECP requires a notice of EA availability to be distributed electronically two weeks in advance of the Notice of Submission. On February 6, 2026, the MFFN CAR Project Team sent an advance notice of availability and upcoming Notice of Submission email to the contact list. The email was intended to help plan for the upcoming review period and keep people informed about next steps. The Notice of Submission was attached, including information on the formal publication on February 20, 2026.

4.3.2 Video

The Why the Road to Marten Falls video was posted on the Community Access Road website on February 10, 2026, and covers the community benefits of the Community Access Road. The video features a Senior Community Member Advisor who explains the benefits of the Community Access Road to MFFN. These benefits include a lower cost of living, increased housing, a positive impact on mental health, and freedom to travel for community members.

4.3.3 Other Communication Activities

Communication activities were also carried out during this period. E-Blasts continued to be distributed to the contact list with supporting updates provided via social media.

A Fall Field Notice was distributed on September 16, 2025, via email and posted on the website. The field notice included updates on the groundwater well decommissioning, geotechnical investigation, and SkyTEM geophysical survey field programs which were

scheduled to take place in Fall 2025. On September 27, 2025, an additional field notice was distributed via email and posted on the website to provide further information on the SkyTEM geophysical survey that was planned to take place in Fall 2025. A Geotechnical Investigation Field Notice was distributed on November 10, 2025, via email and posted on the website. The field notice included information on the geotechnical investigation program, which was planned for November and December 2025. Based on feedback from Indigenous Communities, the field work was postponed to avoid winter hunting activities.

4.4 Consultation and Engagement During and After Submission of Final EA / IS

A number of activities occurred on and shortly after the submission of the Final EA / IS. These are included below to demonstrate consultation and engagement efforts following the submission of the Final EA / IS, and occurred after February 20, 2026.

4.4.1 Notice of Submission

The Notice of Submission is a formal public notice issued when a Project Proponent submits a completed environmental assessment to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks. The Notice of Submission for the Community Access Road is distributed to the Community Access Road contact list, posted on the Community Access Road website, and advertised in newspapers. The notice provides information on the Assessment Process, where to access the EA / IS, in-person viewing locations for the Assessment Summary Package, the review period length, and how to provide comments.

4.4.2 Assessment Summary Package

An Assessment Summary is provided to support the review of the Final EA / IS. This includes the Chief's letter, an executive summary, plain-language summaries of information contained in the Final EA / IS and associated Technical Support Documents, and frequently asked questions. The information in the Assessment Summary Package will also be available online including translations in Ojibway, Oji-Cree, Cree, and French.

4.4.3 Comments and Responses on the Final EA / IS

Proponent-led consultation and engagement officially ends with the submission of the Final EA / IS to the regulators. Consultation and engagement during the review of the Final EA / IS is undertaken by the federal and provincial agencies. The Proponent, however, will support the regulators in responding to comments on the Final EA / IS, including attending meetings, to support the comment period for the Final EA / IS.

Additionally, some reports may be distributed to interested persons who are members of Indigenous communities following the submission of the Final EA / IS.

4.4.4 Meetings with Interested Persons

Ongoing engagement with local outfitters is expected to continue through the detail design and construction phases of the project. A meeting with a local outfitter was being planned during the preparation the Final EA / IS. The date, however, was not yet finalized and the meeting is expected to take place shortly after the release of the Final EA / IS.

The MFFN Community Access Road Project Team will also attend the 2026 Prospectors & Developers Association of Canada Conference from March 1 to 4, 2026.

4.4.5 Video

The Final EA / IS video will be posted to accompany the submission of the Final EA / IS and will provide a summary of what is included in the Final EA / IS, information on how to provide feedback, and the importance of receiving feedback for the Community Access Road.

6. Summary of Feedback Received and Response / Action

Input from interested persons spans several key phases of the Assessment Process, including feedback on data collection programs, mitigation strategies, permitting concerns, and potential impacts on local infrastructure.

Interested persons shared concerns about potential effects on fish and fish habitat, spawning areas, wildlife movement, ungulate populations, and how the road could affect hunting activity. They also provided comments related to cultural heritage, the importance of diversity in community well-being interviews, the Terms of Reference approval process, and how the multiple road projects would be managed by provincial regulators. Input included concerns regarding cumulative effects and suggestions relating to the Project Inclusions List, including adding the KWG Railway Project. Additional feedback related to mapping, potential impacts on tourism outfitters and other businesses, safety concerns associated with traffic and road access, proximity of crossings to camps, and the location of the Ogoki River crossing. Interested persons also expressed perspectives on the duration of the Assessment Process, asked about the implications of the Impact Statement extension, and made suggestions related to Indigenous involvement.

The information provided by interested persons contributed to several aspects of the Assessment Process. Feedback informed fish and fish habitat evaluation, ungulate assessments, the cumulative effects assessment, and the Project Inclusions List. It supported refinements to mapping, contributed to route selection considerations, and was incorporated into land and resource use analyses, including tourism outfitter assessments and public safety considerations. Additionally, the feedback was reflected in assessment planning and responses to delays caused by external events, and in the extension of the Draft Environmental Assessment / Impact Statement review period.

Table 3 summarizes issues raised by interested persons from October 29, 2021, to September 5, 2025, the related responses / actions, and notes where feedback has been addressed or considered in the Final EA / IS. Note some issues were received from interested persons before October 29, 2021, and were responded to after October 29, 2021, therefore they are included in this report. The majority of feedback provided was categorized as an interest or comment and not an issue. An issue is defined as a question, statement, data, and / or information brought forward by an Indigenous community, government agency, the public, or other interested persons that has the potential to influence the Assessment Process. An interest / comment list is included in **Appendix B12 (as part of Appendix XB-B)**.

A detailed record of the efforts made to consult and engage with interested persons from October 29, 2021, to September 5, 2025, is provided in the following section. All

feedback provided, including an interest or comment, is included in the communication log for each respective group and separated by year in **Section 7**. Mass communications distributed to all interested persons are included in **Section 8**.
