Figure 10-1: Kingfisher Lake First Nation Distribution of Communication

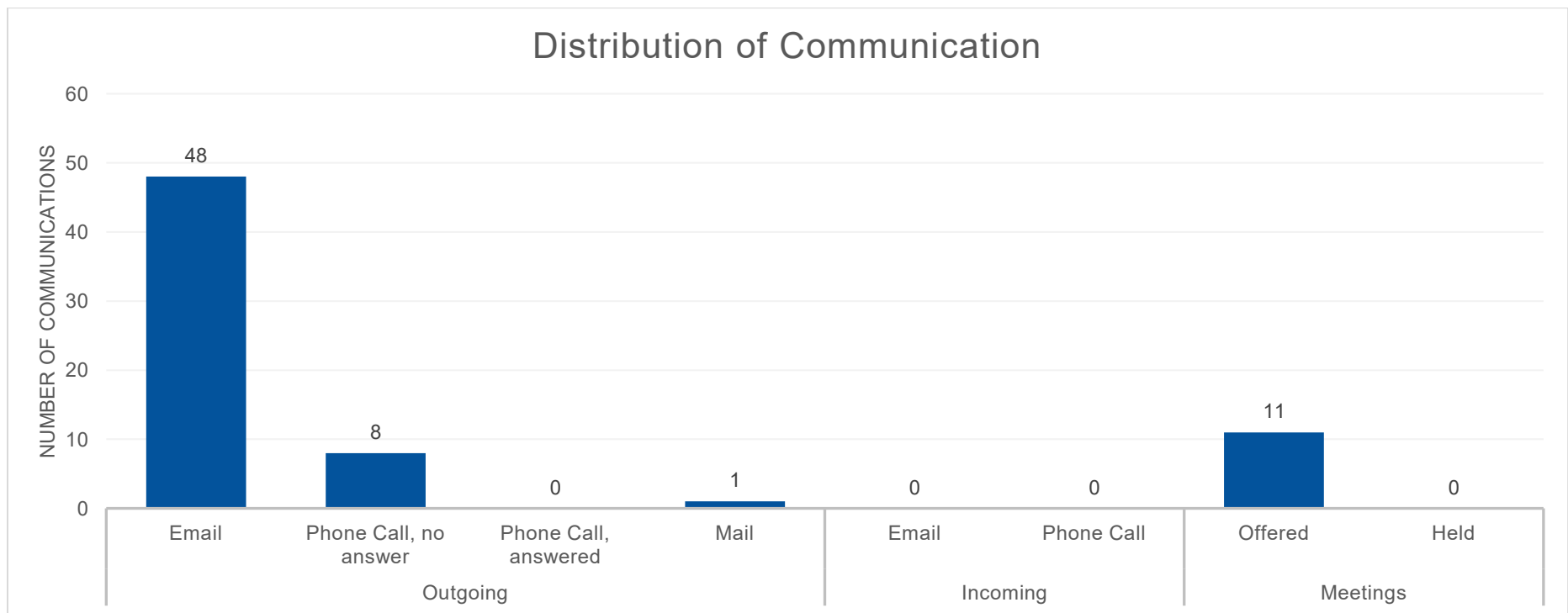
